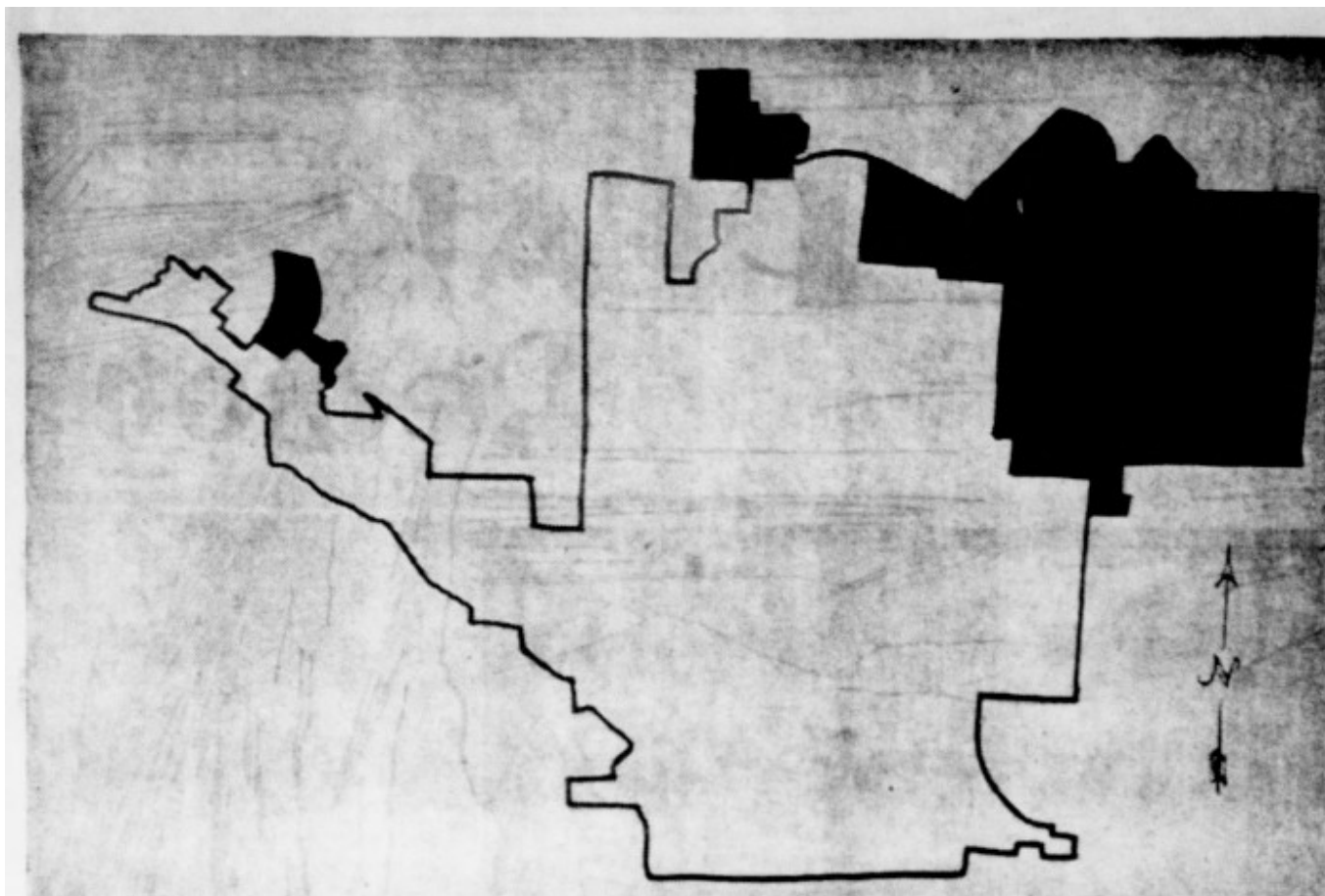

CITY GROWS — Since 1946, Colorado Springs has added 3.04 square miles, or 1,910.53 acres, to its area as a result of a growing population in the area. At present, the city covers 11.59 square miles. Annexed areas are shown in black on this map. The area on the West Side, at the left of the map, includes Pleasant Valley, Cockrum's Addition and

Glenview. The area at the north end of the city is Roswell Addition, embracing 138.69 acres. The northeast section includes Bonnyville, Belleville, Templeton Gap Addition, Paseo Addition, Palmer Park District, East End No. 2, Rotary Heights, Henderson Addition and a section of Knob Hill.
